- Q:** Does the Academy address social skills issues that effect students with learning disabilities and students on the autism spectrum?
A: Yes, along with an individualized academic curriculum, each student has a social skills and life skills component within their curriculum, as well as an individualized working transition program designed to create a successful path into post-secondary life.
- Q:** Will my child graduate with a diploma?
A: Yes. Your child will graduate with a diploma recognized by the state of Missouri.
- Q:** What is your student to teacher ratio?
A: Average 3:1
- Q:** Do you offer financial aid?
A: Yes, based upon family income.
- Q:** Is the Academy of St. Louis accredited?
A: Yes, the Academy is accredited through AdvancEd.
- Q:** Are your teachers certified?
A: Yes, our teachers are certified special education teachers through the state of Missouri.
- Q:** Does the Academy provide one-on-one tutoring for my child?
A: Yes, the Academy provides tutoring in subjects according to each student's needs.
- Q:** Do students ever transition back to their previous school after being at the Academy?
A: Yes, many students transition back to their previous schools after receiving the educational benefits availed to them by the Academy.
- Q:** Does the Academy only accept students on the autism spectrum?
A: No, the Academy accepts students with learning disabilities, developmental delays, speech/language/writing disorders, emotional disorders, as well as students on the autism spectrum.
